Sport Premium Plan 2015-16

What is Sport Premium?

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government have allocated to schools since 2013. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age the school has.

The sport premium grant is to be used to:

Increase the quality & breadth of Primary PE & Sport provision and increasing participation in PE & Sport.

At Durham Trinity School & Sports College we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils.

Sport Premium funding for Durham Trinity School & Sports College 2014 -15 is £8,335. This is paid in 2 instalments -October 2015 (£4,834.30) and April (£3639.30). The amount is based on a lump sum grant and 67 pupils being eligible.

The money will be used for:

1) Investing in the Durham & Chester-le-Street School Sport Partnership

(www.durhamclsssp.org.uk) Basic Service Level Agreement to provide the school with the following:

- A fully organised annual programme of competitions/tournaments/festivals.
- Access to Level 1 – 3 of the School Games. To provide an increased opportunity for participation at Level 1. An increased cohort of pupils who access Level 2 competitions and an increase of opportunity to access more competitions leading to an increase of pupils and competitions that pupil's access at Level 3.
- Access to a set amount of transport to festivals/competitions as agreed.
- Participation, inclusion and Participation, inclusion and excellence opportunities
- CPD for curriculum physical education for staff.
- Access to the Gifted and Talented multi skill academy for pupils in Year 5 & 6. This primary work will impact on KS3 multi skill academy programme.
- Provision of a minimum of 3 x 6 week blocks of curriculum and or after school activity in a variety of sports.
- SSP Network meetings to support P.E. Coordinators /PLT s in their role developing P.E. and School Sport within.
- Promotion and development of links to local sports clubs.
- Access to phase 4 of Judo programme for primary pupils in school.
- Access to Team Durham, Zambia Run and PSHE assembly as part of the Zambia Run.

2) To contribute towards (£7,810) specialist P.E. teaching delivery within all areas of the primary department.

PLANNED OUTCOMES	IMPACT
Primary pupils have access to an increased number and variety of external sporting events (competitive and non-competitive). The range of activities promotes pupils learning and inclusion opportunities.	Increased participation across KS1/2. Pupil's confidence will increase. Pupils will demonstrate they can transfer learnt skills in another environment and/or discipline. Pupil's development of physical skills will increase. Higher level performers will compete alongside mainstream peers. Higher level performers will access pathways in competition into Level 3 and 4 of the School Games. Participation will have positive impact on other curriculum areas (i.e. PSHE).
Eligible pupils will attend a 3 day SEN gifted and talented course.	Pupil's confidence and self-esteem will increase. Working at a higher level will increase their physical skills.
All primary pupils receive weekly specialist PE teaching and swimming lessons as part of their timetable.	This enables pupils to access high quality PE activities/opportunities. Teaching assistants are up skilled to lead events and activities (EVOLVE documents). Pupil skills are developed because of this specialist provision (BSquared assessment, sporting event achievements).
Specialist PE teaching staff deliver PE throughout the school.	The provision offers continuity at pupil transition points.
Identified staff will access CPD opportunities (CPD records).	Non specialist staff skills will increase. Delivery of PE lessons/activities will be at least good.

As part of the school sport ethos pupils accessing additional sessions (extracurricular and coaching sessions) are signposted to community based clubs/identified pathways for gifted and talented.
