**Sport Premium Plan 2019-20 Review Statement**

**What is Sport Premium?**

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government have allocated to schools to support additional physical activity sessions. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age the school has.

The sport premium grant is to be used to:

**Fund an increase and sustainable improvement to the provision of P.E. and School Sport for the benefit of primary aged pupils and to encourage the development of healthy active lifestyles and emotional well-being.**

**At Durham Trinity School & Sports College we strive to promote healthy active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils to be physically healthy and engaged in competitive and non- competitive sporting opportunities and to offer them extended opportunities to develop as well as promoting their Physical, mental health and well-being.**

- **As a result our aim is to:- develop or add to the P.E. , Physical activity and sport activities that our schools already offers.**
- **Build capacity and capability within school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.**

Unfortunately March 2020 onwards all delivery was affected due to COVID 19 and national lockdown. All summer activities and planned allocation cancelled. Money will be carried over into September 2020 delivery. (Primary premium sessions resuming September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020 to include an additional slot for our Year 7 class.)
