Provider Access Policy Statement

Introduction

This policy statement set outs the arrangements for managing the access of external providers to students from Durham Trinity School and Sports College for the purposes of providing information and guidance about their local training and education offer.

The policy statement complies with the Durham Trinity School and Sports College's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

Student Entitlement

All students are entitled: -

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of the careers programme, which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer regarding technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies, careers workshops or conventions and taster events.
- To understand how to make applications for technical courses and apprenticeships.
