What is Sport Premium?

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government allocates to schools. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age the school has.

The sport premium grant is to be used to:

Fund an increase and sustainable improvement to the provision of P.E. and School Sport for the benefit of primary aged pupils and to encourage the development of healthy active lifestyles and emotional well-being.

At Durham Trinity School & Sports College we strive to promote healthy active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils to be physically healthy and engaged in competitive and non- competitive sporting opportunities and to offer them extended opportunities to develop as well as promoting their Physical, mental health and well-being.

- **As a result our aim is to:- develop or add to the P.E. , Physical activity and sport activities that our schools already offers working alongside Covid 19 risk assessments.**
- **Build capacity and capability within school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.**
- **Using targeted interventions improve opportunities for additional physical activity for a discreet group of primary aged pupils helping them improve their mental health and emotional well- being working alongside Covid 19 risk assessments.**

Sport Premium funding for Durham Trinity School & Sports College 2019 , 2020 is £16,870, it is paid in 2 instalments, 7/12 s of funding is paid October 2020 (£9784.60) and 5/12 (April, 2021) (£7085.40) following Department of Education guidance.
